
General Tip to protect your new furniture, We suggest the following:

- Avoid sitting on the edge of the seat.
- Keep off the arms! They're not designed to support full body weight.
- Be careful of your clothing, as poky bits can cause damage to the fabric.
- Avoid placing your sofa too close to an open fire or radiator, as excessive heat can wear on the fabric.
- Lift don't drag! It's better for your floors as well as your sofa's legs and castors.
- Position furniture out of direct sunlight to avoid color fading and sun-bleaching.
- Keep your cushions looking fresh with regular plumping.
- Avoid heavy spot cleaning as this could result in pile damage and watermarks.
- Where needed, routinely swap reversible cushions to ensure even wear.
- Give your sofa a regular refresh by brushing it or vacuuming it with a soft brush attachment.
- Be quick to wipe up spills! And when you do, blot, don't scrub.
- Avoid exposure to household chemicals like cosmetics and cleaning materials.
- Keep tabs on the position of your sofa's legs to ensure they haven't spun out of place and use the fixing screws where provided.
- Never force a zip closed. Make sure zips are aligned and if you have trouble,
 remove the cover and check that nothing is preventing closure.

Keeping it Clean

Upholstery fabric doesn't fare well in the washing machine. Instead, we recommend professional upholstery cleaning on-site every 18 months. In case of mishaps like drink or food spills, reach out to a local specialist cleaning company. Regular vacuuming and gentle brushing of your furniture for daily care can prevent dust particles from settling and impacting the fabric's durability and color.

If you have young children, sticky fingers and biscuit crumbs are often part of the deal. Therefore, choosing an easy-to-clean sofa with durable fabric is usually the best choice. When spills occur, promptly blot them away with a slightly damp, clean cloth, preferably muslin. Avoid scrubbing, as this can risk damaging the pile, especially with velvet. Excessive water can lead to watermarks and discoloration. It's advisable to steer clear of using cleaning solutions on any upholstery.

Pets are considered part of the family, and we understand that. However, fur, claws, and muddy paws can take a toll on your sofa. We recommend choosing durable fabrics that are easier to clean in such cases. When in doubt, seek professional advice before attempting to clean upholstery yourself. Leather

To care for your leather sofa, start with regular cleaning using a soft, damp cloth or a vacuum cleaner with a gentle brush attachment. Avoid harsh cleaners and opt for leather-specific products or a mild soap and water mixture. Periodically, apply a leather conditioner to maintain the leather's suppleness and

prevent drying or cracking. Protect your sofa from direct sunlight to prevent fading and drying. If you have pets, use furniture covers or train them to avoid scratching. For spills, blot immediately and use a leather cleaner if necessary.

Keep your sofa away from heat sources and consider professional cleaning every few years.

Polyfiber

Fabric Pilling & Bobbling

Certain natural fabrics may develop slight pilling or bobbling over time. To maintain their fresh appearance, you can use fabric shavers gently to remove these imperfections.

When it comes to sofa beds, here's a tip: When you first open your sofa bed, check if the mechanism is securely tied before attempting to extend it. Don't be alarmed if you hear a slight creak during use – it's, not you!

Plastic Wrapping & Storage

Creasing, Fading, & Dyes

Velvet and Chenille Fabrics: Over time, it's natural for the pile on velvet and chenille fabrics to flatten slightly. To maintain their fresh appearance, we recommend brushing them in the direction of the pile.

Linen: Linen tends to crease due to its natural properties, but rest assured, these creases won't cause any long-term damage.

Sunlight Protection: Whenever possible, position your furniture away from direct sunlight. This helps prevent color fading and sun bleaching, preserving the vibrancy of your unbolstery.

Dye Transfer Caution: While all our upholstery fabrics are designed to be colorfast, it's wise to be cautious when wearing heavily dyed clothing, like jeans, on a light-colored sofa, especially if the clothing is damp. In the event of dye transfer, don't hesitate to contact a furniture cleaning specialist promptly for assistance.

Corner & Chaise Sofa

Our corner and chaise sofas come with a clever bracket that connects. Before you sit or put any weight on your sofa, ensure that the bracket is securely fastened. This prevents the risk of bending. If you need to move your sofa, always unhook the bracket, and move each module separately. Avoid attempting to move the entire sofa in one piece or dragging it, as this could potentially twist the frame or break the bracket.

Cushions

Give them a good plump and flip them a couple of times a week. Once a month, unzip the case and gently beat the edges to fluff up the filling.

If needed, open the zip slightly to let air out. Foam and fiber cushions can flatten over time, so regular plumping is key.
